

Message "The Third Sunday in Lent" Pastor Anna Viehland

<u>Topic</u>: God's idea of justice is vastly different from our own.

Scripture: Luke 13:1-9

1 At that very time there were some present who told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices.

2 He asked them, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse

sinners than all other Galileans? 3 No, I tell you, but unless you repent you will all perish as they did. 4 Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them--do you think that they were worse offenders than all the other people living in Jerusalem? 5 No, I tell you, but unless you repent you will all perish just as they did."

6 Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. 7 So he said to the man working the vineyard, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?'

8 He replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. 9 If it bears fruit next year, well and good, but if not, you can cut it down.'"



ANSWERS TO TRIVIA QUESTIONS

- 1. "Leave them alone and they'll come home, wagging their tails behind them."
- Roquefort is a renowned French blue cheese, made from raw sheep's milk, and aged in the Combalou caves of Roquefort-sur-Soulzon, known for its distinctive blue veins and sharp, tangy flavor.
- 3. Four: the rumen, reticulum, omasum, and abomasum.
- Dolly (5 July 1996 14 February 2003) was a female Finn-Dorset sheep and the first mammal that was cloned from an adult somatic cell.
- Sheep have <u>horizontal</u>, <u>rectangular</u> pupils, a distinct shape compared to the round pupils of humans, which aids in their ability to see nearly all around them.
- 6. 32 teeth. 8 incisors and 24 molars.
- 7. "Broken Mouth" or "Gummer"
- Sheep, like other ruminants, have a unique dental arrangement: <u>they lack</u> <u>upper front teeth</u>, instead possessing a hard, fibrous dental pad to aid in grazing, while having eight permanent incisors in the lower jaw.
- The Spanish brought the first domestic sheep, likely of the Churra breed, to North America, with <u>Christopher Columbus'</u> second voyage in 1493.
- 10. "White as snow"
- 11. In the biblical story of <u>Nathan</u> and the pet lamb, <u>Nathan</u>, a prophet, uses a parable to expose King David's sin of adultery and murder, leading David to repent.
- 12. One year of age
- 13. The phrase "do not cook a lamb in its mother's milk" (or "do not boil a kid in its mother's milk") is a commandment found in the Torah (Exodus 23:19, Exodus 34:26, Deuteronomy 14:21.)
- 14. Texas first (730,000), then California (550,000)
- 15. 1.2 Billion
- 16. "One for the master, one for the dame, And one for the little girl who lives down the lane."
- 17. "Feed my Sheep." John 21:17
- 18. "Baa-ram-ewe! Baa-ram-ewe! To your breed, your fleece, your clan be true! Sheep be true! Baa-ram-ewe!"
- 19. In Exodus 12:46, Moses instructed that the Passover lamb should be eaten in one house, and that no part of the flesh should be carried outside, <u>nor should any</u> of its bones be broken.
- 20. "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world" is from John 1:29, where John the Baptist identifies Jesus as the Messiah, emphasizing his role as a sacrificial lamb who atones for humanity's sins.
